ADJOINING CLAIMS.

This survey is surrounded entirely by U. S. Land.

INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Lietz Light Mountain transit-theodolite, No. 13-5929. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by the use of a Saegmuller Solar attachment, checked by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500 foot steel tape.

REPORT.

Owing to the fact that part of this group is more

than two miles from a corner of the PUBLIC SURVEY, I established U. S. M M No. 3771 as described in a separate report submitted herewith.

The south 1/4 corner of Sec. 34 T.9 N.R.1 W is a pipe properly set and marked.

I also found a stone properly set and chiseled 1/4 S C on the north face, it being a granite stone 6 x 8 x 14 inches exposed. This corner stone bears N. 56° - 41' E. 115.5 feet from the pipe corner to which connection was made in my return.

It is impossible to accurately segregate improvements made by prior claimants, from those made by the claimant, and I have had to rely on the best information available for my certificate of expenditure. See affidavit of M.T. Sullivan and J.B. Young, herewith.

The discrepancies found existing between the claims as marked by the location monuments and as described in the location notices are due to errors in the location notices.


