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INSTRUMENT AND DETERMINATION OF MERIDIAN.

This survey was made with a 64 inch Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Polaris observation, verified by Solar observation.

monument was computed through a traverse run N.64°-19 W. 344.1 ft., thence N.71°-54'W. 646.9 ft. from Cor. No. 1 to said monument.

Globe, Arizona, October/7, 1921. In the execution of Mineral Survey No. 3787, I find that the claims are not within the two mile limit of an approved corner of the public survey or a U.S.L.M., so established U.S.L.M. No. 3787.

There being no suitable post available, I selected a limestone boulder, which shows 1.5 x 3 x 5 ft. above the bedding, and which is situated on the top of a high ridge, visible for a great distance in all directions, chiseled a cross and U.S.L.M. 3787 on top of it and erected a monument of stone 6 ft. base, 5 ft. high, N.14°W. 17.0 ft. from it.

This monument is on the north side of Salt River, about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles in an easterly direction from the Peninsula, a local land mark; and is approximately in Latitude  $33^{\circ}-48^{\circ}N$ .

The 20½ Mile Monument on the West Boundary of the White Mountain or San Carlos Indian Reservation is visible, and bears S.70°-Ol'W. about 11000 feet.

Cor. No.1 of Mineral Survey No. 3787 bears S.69°-16'E. 989.0 feet.

A limestone boulder, 1 x 1.5 x 2.5 ft. out of the ground, chiseled cross B.R. U.S.L.M. 3787, bears N.64°-08'E. 18.20 feet.

A cross on limestone in place, about which is chiseled B.R. U.S.L.M. 3787, bears S.42°-03'E. 18.1 feet.
