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#### DISCOVERY AND IMPROVEMENTS.

I certify that the value of the labor and improvements made upon, or for the benefit of, each of the locations embraced in this survey, by the claimant or its grantors, is not less than five hundred dollars, and that said improvements consist of:

#### Common Improvement

The claims in this survey are being developed through a system of work extended from a vertical shaft located on the Iron Cap lode, Mineral Survey No. 2430, the center of which bears S. 29°-49'E. 3086.9 ft. from Cor. No. 1 of the Hope lode.
