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LOCATION.

This survey is located approximately in T. 5 N., R.

% Secs. 35 & 36, T. 6 N. R.17 E, 17 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., unsurveyed, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Gila County, Arizona.

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ADJOINING AND CONFLICTING CLAIMS.

This survey is bounded on the north, east, south and west by unappropriated Indian Reservation. An unknown claim, unsurveyed, conflicts at the southwest corner of the survey, and the claims of Sur. 3820 owned by L.R. Jacobson et al. conflicts almost in their entirety with the survey.

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INSTRUMENT AND DETERMINATION OF MERIDIAN.

This survey was made with a 61 inch Berger transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observations. The distances were measured with a 660 foot steel tape.

REPORT.

The 212 Mile Meander Corner, on the West Boundary of the White Mountain or San Carlos Indian Reservation, to which tie is given is a 1 inch iron post set in mound of stone, with brass cap marked MC 212 M 27.8 chs. PL WMIR AWB 1915. The surface of the ground along the line from Cor. No. 1 of the survey to the Meander Corner being very steep and rough, and it being necessary to cross Salt River, with the line, which at the date of making this survey, on account of high water could not be done, I resorted to triangulation to obtain the tie. From Cor. No. 1, by turning the angle off of line 4-1, I determine the bearing to the Meander Corner to be 8.62°-31'-20"W. Then from a point on line 4-1, 8.39°-25'E. 3248.7 ft. from Cor. No. 1, by turning the angle off of line 4-1

I determine the bearing to the Meander Corner to be N.

81°-08'-10"W. Solving the resulting triangle, I obtain
the tie reported herein. I determine the area in
conflict of Survey No. 3820 with this survey by retracing
the lines of Sur. 3820. I find a nominal error in all
the lines of said survey, and an error in excess of
the limit of error in the tie line from Cor. No. 1 of
said Sur. 3820 to the Slivile Meander Corner, as
computed through the lines of this survey. All the
corners of said Sur. 3820 are either stones in place
or set stones with mounds of stone alongside, each of
which are properly chiseled with number of corner and
survey number.
