INSTRUMENT.

The distances were measured with a five hundred foot steel tape.

REPORT.

The lode line of the location embraced in this survey was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

U.S.M.M.No.1.

U.S.M.M.No.1 was found to be a sandstone 8 ins.by 20 ins. square, projecting 1 foot above the ground, chiseled with a + on top and U.S.M.M.No.1-PRESTON on the east face. Diligent search and extensive inquiry was made for corners of the Public Survey within a radius of several miles of said claim, but there are apparently none to be found. As these corners are purported to have been set some fifty years ago, it is quite probable that if any remain standing they have been buried by the shifting sands of this region.
