An unknown claim, owner unknown, adjoins on the south. And, an unknown claim, unsurveyed, owner unknown; and the Santo Nino lode, Sur. 3113, owned by the claimant, conflicts on the west.

Expenditure of Five Hundred Dollars.

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Location.

This survey is located on unsurveyed land, in whath sec. 9 will probably be T.24 S., R. 16 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., in the Patagonia Mining District, Santa Cruz County, Arizona, and within the Coronado Natl Forest.

Instrument and Determination of Meridian. This survey was made with a $6\frac{1}{4}$ inch Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observations. The distances were measured with a 660 foot steel tape.

Tie to this monument was computed through a traverse extending from Cor. No. 1 N.77°-28'E. 44.0 ft.; thence N.20°-20'W. 600.2 ft.; thence N.86°-13'E. 1358.5 ft.; thence N.27°-41'E. 668.1 ft.; thence N.74°-04'E. 4352.6 ft. to said monument.
