No. 4, a caved shaft, 8 x 8 ft., 35 ft. deep, untimbered, the center of which bears N.55°W. 38.0 ft. from a point on the lode line 937.3 ft. from the N.L.C. Value, \$900.00.

No. 5, 135 ft. of cut and tunnel, 4 x 6 ft., the center of the toe of which bears S.13°-33'W. 71.9 ft. from the last above described point, and which extends thence N.17°W. 90.0 ft.; thence N.35°L. 45.0 ft. to face. Value, \$1600.00.

Instrument and Determination of Meridian. This survey was made with a $6\frac{1}{4}$ inch Berger transit. The distances were measured with a 660 ft. steel tape. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as

determined by direct Solar observations.

Note. The section corner common to sections 10, 11, 14 and 15, to which tie is given, is a diabase stone showing 4 x 6 x 9 ins. out of the ground, with cross at the exact corner, two grooves on the east edge, four grooves on the south edge, and 1 M on the northside. Tie to this corner was made direct from Cor. No. 1
