This survey was made with a Keuffel and Esser mountain transit No.27089. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 300-ft steel tabe.

REPORT.

The lode line was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

The Std.Cor.of Secs. 32_R T.13 N., R.1 W., Gila and Salt River Meridian, is a granite stone, $36 \times 20 \times 12$ ins., chiseled (x) and S.C. This is the nearest corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

The disagreements between these field notes and the amended location certificate are due to errors in the certificate.
