
INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Berger & Sons No. 1 c transit. The distances were measured with 150 and 300 foot steel tapes. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a direct solar observation. Magnetic variation 13° East at all corners.

REPORT.

The std. Cor. of Secs. 32 and 33, T 1 N, R 17 E is an iron pipe with copper cap, marked for these two sections. The south 1/4 corner of Sec. 33 is an iron pipe with copper cap.

The east side line of this claim follows practically the east edge of the bed of tufa stone. This bed is a flat bed of stone, from 18 inches to 30 inches in thickness. The Indian Reservation has a quarry on the western edge of this same bed of stone and if this claim were run due north and south, the southwestern corner of this claim would conflict.


