Mineral. Survey No.4175 was made with a Lietz Light Mountain transit No. 9503, Model No. 9, with horizontal limb 5 ins. diameter having double opposite verniers, and full. vertical circle 5 ins. diameter, having double opposite verniers; the horizontal verniers reading to thirty seconds of arc, and the vertical verniers reading to one minute of arc; the eye piece is fitted to receive a prismatic eye-piece suitable for making direct observations upon the sun. This instrument is also ecuipped with a Saegmuller Solar attachment for making observations upon the sun. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order. Altitude observations of the sun for azimuth, and at noon on the meridian for latitude. were made, the details of which observations are shown in the calculation sheets herewith submitted for examination. All azimuths in this record are referred to the true meridian thus determined, by the method of deflection angles and calculated courses.
