## MINERAL SURVEY NO. 4181, ARIZONA

Mineral Survey No. 4181 was made with a Lietz Light Mountain transit No. 9503, Model No. 9, with horizontal limb 5 ins. diam., having two double opposite verniers, and full vertical circle 5 ins. diam., having double opposite verniers; the horizontal verniers reading to thirty seconds of arc, and the vertical verniers reading to one minute of arc; the eye piece is fitted to receive a prismatic eye-piece suitable for making direct observations upon the sun. This instrument is also equipped with a Saegmuller Solar attachment for making observations upon the sun. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order. Altitude observations of the sun for azimuth, and at noon on the meridian for latitude were made, the details of which observations are shown in the calculation sheets herewith submitted for examination. All azimuths in this record are referred to the true meridian thus determined, by the method of deflection angles and calculated courses.

The lines were measured with a 1/8 inch steel tape 500 feet in length, graduated every foot; having been compared with a steel standard tape at the time of beginning the survey, and found correct.

All lines and connections of this survey were run by direct methods. The magnetic variation observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of 15° 00' E.
