

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons precise transit, eith horizontal limb 6.25 ins. diam., having two double opposite verniers, and full vertical circle, 5 ins. diam., having one double vernier, the verniers read to one minute of arc; the eye-piece is equipped with a colored glass slide in a detachable prismatic eye-piece for making direct observations upon the sun. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order.

All azimuths in this record were determined by the method of deflection angles referred to the meridian determined by the following observation:

April 20, 1951, at Cor. No. 1 of the Victory # 1 lode in latitude 33° 40° No., and longitude 112° 02° Wo., I made a series of eight altitude observations upon the sur for azimuth at approximately equal time intervals, four each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions, observing opposite limbs of the sun, and reading the horizontal angle from Cor. No. 2 of the Victory # 1 lode to the sun.

Mean observed vertical angle to

True bearing to reference point - - - S. 33° oo' W.

The lines were measured with a Keuffel & Esser steel tape, 500 feet in length, graduated to feet, tenths and hundredths of feet for the entire length; a Keuffel & Esser steel tape, 100 feet in length, graduated to feet, tenths and hundredths of feet for the entire length. Both tapes were compared to a Lufkin standard tape at the time of beginning the survey and found correct.

All lines and connections of the survey were run by direct methods.

The magnetic declination observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of 14° 40° E.
