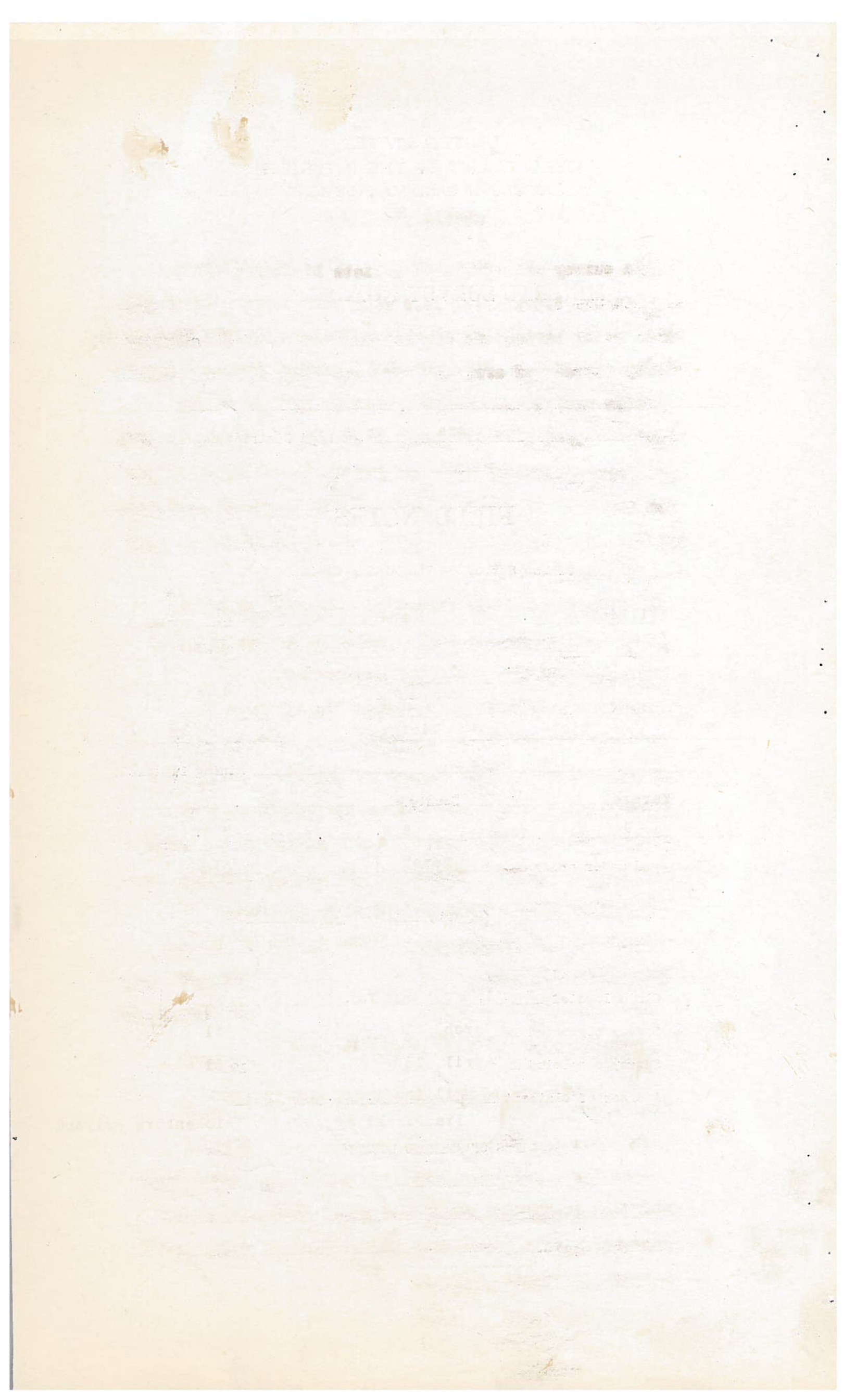

SURVEY NO. 4356

This survey was made with a Lietz Light Mountain transit No. 9508, Model No. 9 with horizontal limb 5 ins. in diameter having two double opposite verniers reading to thirty seconds of arc, and full vertical circle 5 ins. in diameter having two double verniers reading to one minute of arc; the eye piece is fitted to receive a prismatic eye piece suitable for making direct observations upon the sun or Polaris. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order.

All azimuths in this record were determined by the method of deflection angles referred to the meridian determined by the following observations.

April 17, 1951 at the Cor. No. 4 Victor lode in Latitude $34^{\circ}-03'00''$ N. and Longitude $112^{\circ}-34'-30''$ W., I made a series of four direct and reversed position observations upon Polaris during the period of its western elongation, observing the center of the star during its vertical movement, and reading the horizontal angles from a reference point to the star.

Mean time of observation, 105th meridian Standard time April 17, 1951.

Declination of Polaris $89^{\circ}-02'-11.31''$

Mean observed vertical angle to star's center. $34^{\circ}-03'$

Mean horizontal angle from reference point to Star's center $1^{\circ}-10'$

True bearing to reference point NORTH

The lines were measured with a 1/8 inch steel tape 500 feet in length, graduated every foot, which was compared with a steel tape at the time of beginning the survey, and found correct.

All lines and connections of this survey were run by direct methods.

The magnetic declination observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of $14^{\circ}-30'E$.

 pipe with brass cap properly set and marked as appears
 in the official record.

The corners of this survey are iron pipe 3/4 inch

in diameter and $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet long driven 18 inches into the ground and surrounded by a substantial mound of stone. The pipe is fitted with a $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch floor flange to which is securely bolted a copper disc, which I marked according to the respective corner requirements.

The corners of Mineral Survey ^{No. 1477} are marked stones left loosely in the mounds of stone at the respective corner points. The corners are marked with the number of the corner and number of the survey only.

The corners of Mineral Survey No. 4039 are marked stones properly set and chiseled with the proper markings for the respective corners.




