This survey was made with a Bausch & Lomb Precise Transit No. 9259, with horizontal limb 5-1/2 ins. diam., having two single opposite verniers, and full vertical circle 4-1/4 ins. diam., having two double opposite verniers, all verniers reading to one minute of arc. The eyepiece is equipped with a colored glass set in the dust shutter, for making direct observations on the sun. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey, and all adjustments were in good order.

All azimuths in this record were determined by the method of double horizontal angles referred to the meridian determined by the following observations:

July 11, 1962, at Cor. No. 4 of the Winter Gold lode, in latitude 33°27' N., and longitude 111°30' W., I make a series of four altitude observations (in two sets of two each) upon the sun for azimuth, at approximately equal time-intervals, two each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions, observing opposite limbs of the sun, and reading the horizontal angles clockwise, from Cor. No. 1 of the Winter Gold lode 600 feet W'yly, NW. to the sun:

The lines were measured with a Lufkin steel tape, 500 feet in length, graduated every foot, with the end feet graduated to tenths and hundredths; and a Chicago steel tape, 300 feet in length, graduated every foot, with the end feet graduated to tenths; both tapes were compared with a Lufkin standard steel tape at the time of beginning the survey, and found correct.

All lines and connections were run by direct methods.

The magnetic declination observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of 13°30' E.




