General Description.

This town ship contains some high mountains but is mostly rolling and hilly. the soil of the rolling land being sandy while the soil of the mountains is stony and of volcanic origin. None of the soil is very productive being covered with ~~as~~ scrubby cedar, pinon and scattering pines. Dense chico and buck brush cover the rolling land. There are no evidences of any valuable mineral deposits.

There are no springs or streams anywhere in the town ship and an entire absence of water except in the spring after the heavy snows go off. There are no settlers in the town ship.
