quite irregular. The western portion of the Op. is low and gently rolling while the ^{eastern} part is mountainous. There is no timber within this Op. Water is only found in wells dug by settlers. Owing to the rapid growth of the town of Douglas which is situated in Secs 13 and 24 Op. 24 S. R. 27 E. quite a number of settlers are taking up land in the Op. The El Paso and Southwestern railroad runs through secs 5, 6 and 7.
