Survey made with Burt's Patent Improved Solar Compass, nearly new, and in first rate order. Made

by Otto Fennel of Cassel

Germany in 1881

Before proceeding further with the exteriors of this Tp.,

I made a change of 21 minutes in the latitude arc of my solar compass by adding same to the reading previously given, and at noon verified and corrected same by observation on the sun. I also further tested instrument by reversing.

I took the latitude and found it to be $34^{\circ} 47'$ North -
