

On looking over the grounds covered by the Townsites of New Virginia, Logan, Brooklyn and Virginia city I find that the location of all depends on that of New Virginia, the west boundary of which is the base line of the whole.

General Description

The Townsite of New Virginia occupies a gently sloping mesa on the east side of Mt Ben Lomond of the Mulefoot Range. The soil is 2nd & 3rd rate and is covered with a dense growth of Palo Verde ironwood mesquite and several varieties of cactus. The land is of no value for agriculture, or timber and so far as is known contains no valuable mineral. The area is 160 acres.
