Young and Son light mountain transit No. 7492, with solar attachment. The horizontal limb is provided with two double verniers placed opposite to each other, reading to single minutes of arc, which is also the least count of the latitude and declination arcs.

The instrument was examined, tested on the true meridian at Phoenix, found correct, and was approved by the Surveyor eneral for Arizona, July 15, 1907.

I examine the adjustments of the transit, and correct the level and collimation errors, then, to test the solar apparatus, by comparing its indications, resulting from solar observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours, with a meridian determined on Polaris, I proceed as follows.

From the stan. cor, of Tps. 15 South, Rs. 27, and 28
East, latitude 32° 4' 25" N. longitude 119 19 33" W.
I set off 32° 4' N. on the lat. arc, and 64 04' S. on
the decl. arc, and at 5h p.m., l.m.t., determine with
the solar a meridian, and mark a point thereof, on a
stone firmly set in the ground, 5 chs. N. of the cor.
At 12h 20m p.m., by my watch, which is correct, I observe
Polaris at eastern elongation, in accordance with the
Manual of Instructions, and mark a point in the line
thus determined, on a peg driven in the ground, 5 chs.
N. of my station.

October 8, 1907.

October 9, 1907. At 6h a.m., l.m.t., I lay off the azimuth of Polaris 1° 24° to the west, and mark the meridian thus determined, by cutting a small groove in the stone set last night, on which the meridian coincides with the meridian determined by the solar.

At 8h a.m., l.m.t., I set off 32°04' M. on the lat. arc, 5° 57' S. on the decl. arc, and mark a point in the meridian determined with the solar by a cross on the stone already set 5 chs. N. of my station, which coincides within meridian established by the Polaris observation

The magnetic bearing of the true meridian at 8h 30 m a.m., is N. 15° W., the angle thus determined gives the mag decl. 15° E.

From the stan. cor. of Tps. 15 S., Rs. 27 and 28 E., which is a stake marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
