Beginning at a post on the east and west center line of Section 23 from which point both $\frac{1}{4}$ posts can be seen, the transit was jiggled into line of both $\frac{1}{4}$ posts and a line through the center of Section located.

Setting up on the south $\frac{1}{4}$ post of Section 23, from which point the north $\frac{1}{4}$ post can be seen, the north and south center line of the section was located. The intersection of this center line and the center line above mentioned, located with the transit, gave the exact center of Section 23 and, at this point, an iron pin 3 feet by $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, was driven into the ground.


