Survey Commenced June 2nd 1910, and executed
with a W. and L. S. Gurley engineer's transit
No. 76, with a Burt Solar attachment. The
horizontal limb being provided with one double
vernier, reading to single minutes of arc. The
verniers of the latitude and declination axes
reading to 0' 30" of arc.

Determine the adjustments of the transit and
finding them perfect, know from recent tests of
the Solar apparatus by comparing its indications
resulting from solar observations made during
a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian determined
by observations on Polaris that the instrument
is in satisfactory adjustment.

Now last complete test of instrument and
field notes of the survey of the Subdivisional
line of Twp 25 N., R 19 E. in Subdivisional Book "E"
Being unable to find the old closing cov. of
Twp. 24 N., R 19 and 20 E. on the Sixth Stand,

T 25 N., R 19 E., which is the closing distance
given in the original field notes furnished
me by the Surveyor General. Latitude 35° 30' 35" N.
