

Survey commenced June 8, 1914, and executed with a Young and Sons' light mountain transit No.8541, with Smith solar attachment. For description of this instrument and certificate of approval, see Book "A."

I examine the adjustments of the transit, and find them correct; then to test the solar apparatus by comparing its indications, resulting from solar observations, made during a.m. and p,m. hours, with a meridian deter-

mined by observations on Polaris, I proceed as follows:

At my camp, near the center of the NE. ½ of sec.34, T.13

S., R.27 E.; latitude, 32° 15½'N.; longitude, 109° 34'

W., I set off 32° 15½'N. on the lat.arc; 22° 52' N.on
the decl.arc; and at 5h.20m. p.m., l.m.t., determine with the solar a meridian, and mark a point thereon by setting a flag firmly in the ground, about 5 chs. north of my station.

At 8h.18m. p,m., by my watch, which is correct 1.m.t., I observe Polaris in accordance with the Manual of Instructions, and mark a point in the line thus determined on a peg driven in the ground, about 5 chs. north of the same station.

June 8, 1914.

June 9, 1914: At 6h.30m. a.m., l.m.t., I lay off the azimuth of Polaris, 0°2' to the west, which is the azimuth
corresponding to an hour angle of 0h.5m., the point
falling on flag set by solar observation, June 8,1914.

June 9, 1914: At this same station, at 6h. 35m., a.m., l.
m.t., I set off 32°15½'N. on the lat.arc; 22°55½'N.on

the decl.arc; and determine with the solar a meridian, which agrees with the p.m. observation of June 8,1914; therefore, I conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory.

The magnetic decl. of the true meridian, at 6h.40m. a.m., l.m.t., is 13° 25 E.

I test the stadia wire interval, by setting rod 4.016 chs from the instrument; the rod reading is 2.000 ft., which is correct.
