I examine the adjustments of the transit, and find them correct, and from recent tests of the solar apparatus made by comparing its indications, resulting from solar observations, made during a.m. and p.m.hours, with the meridian established by Polaris observation at my camp, March 30,1914, I know that the instrument is in satisfactory adjustment.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township contains nearly every variety of land, from level to mountainous, and the soil ranges from almost barren rock to rich loam. The soil of the level land in the southwestern part of the township is generally a rich fine, dry sandy clay loam, 'capable of producing abundant crops with the aid of irrigation. The soil of the remaining portion of the township is so stony as to be of little value for agricultural purposes.

Dry farming is being pursued by two or three settlers in the township at the present time, but is not proving very successful.

Scattering palo verde, mesquite and ironwood timber is found over hearly the entire township, but the majority of the trees being too small to be of any value other than fuel.

There is no water in the township except in wells which have been either dug or driven by the settlers.

The McDowell Mountains in the northwastern corner of the township rise to an elevation of 4000 ft., and to all appearances contain rich minerals.

There are two settlers in sec. 20, two in sec.29, and one each in secs. 19 and 28.
