Retracement of the Third Guide Meridian West Through Tps. 13 N.

Chains.

Survey commenced Feb 6, 1915, and executed jointly by Irving W. Stoddard, U. S. Surveyor, and R. D. Armstrong, U. S. Transitman, with Young and Sons' light mountain transits, Nos. 8485 and 8531, with Smith solar attachments. For description of instruments, and certificate of approval, see Book "A".

In the following field notes, the initials I. W. S. and R. D. A. refer to Irving W. Stoddard, U. S. Surveyor, and R. D. Armstrong, U. S. Transitman, respectively.

We examine the adjustments of the transits, and find them

- satisfactory; then, to test the solars by comparing their indications, resulting from solar observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours, with a meridian determined by observations on Polaris, we proceed as follows:
- At our camp in sec. 17, T. 13 N., R. 13 W., lat. 34° 28' N., long. 113° 38' W., at 10 hrs. 20.3 m., p.m., l.m.t., by our watches, which are set to correct local mean time, we observe Polaris at western elongation, and mark a point in the line thus determined by a tack driven in a stake, 5 chs. N. of our station. Feb. 6, 1915.

. 7, 1915: At 7 hrs. 45 m., a.m., l.m.t., we lay off the azimuth of Polaris, 1° 23' to the east, and mark Feb. 7, 1915: the meridian thus determined by tacks driven in stakes, 5 chs. I. and 20 lks. S. of our station.

Setting an instrument at each of the two stations 20 lks. apart, we set off 34° 28' N. on the lat. arcs; 15° 28' S. on the decl. arcs; and at 8 hrs. 2 m., a.m., 1.m.t. we determine a meridian with each transit. Each meridian thus determined departs less than l' from the meridian determined by observation on Polaris at elongation.

At 4 hrs. 0 m., p.m., l.m.t., we set off 34° 28' N' on the lat. arcs; 15° 21½' S' on the decl. arcs; and determine a meridian with each transit. Each meridian thus determined departs less than l' from the meridian determined by observations on Polaris at elongation.

The solars, by a.m. and p.m. observations, define positions for meridians which do not depart more than l' from the true meridian determined by observation on Polaris at elongation; we therefore conclude that the instruments are in satisfactory adjustment.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This Tp. consists of rough, rocky, mountainous land, in the South and East portions, and rolling mountainous land in the Northern part. The Big Sandy River, a wide river with low banks, and practically dry a large part of the year, flows southerly through the East portion. All washes drain to the River. On the slopes, there is much bare rock, and but little soil, and intthe washes, sandy soil, mixed with rock, abounds. There is some small amount of grass supporting a few hungry-looking cattle. Practically all the vegetation is of the cactus family and consists of yucca, palo verde, ocatilla, prickly pear, century plant, spanish bayonet, soap weed, cat claw, greasewood, mesquite, etc. Signal, an old mining camp, is in sec. 16, there being a school house, a store, and one or two other houses. In sec. 17 is Walter's Ranch, consisting of a house and about 3 acres of alfalfa, and a few fruit trees.
