GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This Tp. is generally rough, rolling and broken. extreme west portion is particularly rough and broken. The whole Tp. is cut by many washes, sloping south-easter ly to the Big Sandy River, which flows southerly through the east tier of secs. The soil is rocky and sandy, except in some places along the Sandy River, where loam and humus enter, making very good soil. There are a few ranches along the river, but not of any large acreage. Along the river, there are aspen, cottonwood, locust and other trees but the vegetation is generally in the cacti family, consisting of yucca, giant-cacti, cholla, ocatilla, palo verda, cat claw, greasewood, etc. There are some small indications of mineral, and some prospects scattered about.
