

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township consists of rolling land in its western half, and rough and mountainous land in its eastern half The soil in the west half is a coarse sandy loam, ranging in depth from 12 to 18 ins. That in the east half is thin and rocky. Practically all of the township produces a growth of short grass, which, in addition to a growth of mesquite brush, 4 to 6 ft.high, affords good grazing for stock.

A scattering growth of scrub oak and juniper trees, suitable for posts & fuel was found on the mountains in

the east half of this township.

Three springs of water were found in this township; they are located as follows: in the SW. of the NW of sec. 11, in the SW of the SE of sec. 13, and in the SW of the NW of sec. 25.

The Mascot and Western Railway crosses the southern

part of this township.

A great deal. of prospecting has been done along the Dos Cabezas Mountains, in the eastern half of this township.

Top Mitchell has a small cattle ranch in sec. 11. There is also an unoccupied house in sec. 25.
