General Description, T. 16 N., R. 12 W.

This township consists of mountainous land in the eastern portion, terminating in the western part, in low, broken foot hills. The township is cut by numerous dry washes draining in a westerly direction, into Big Sandy Creek. Sycamore and Bitter Creeks contain permanent water above the points where they enter the township, the water sinking shortly thereafter.

The soil is very rocky, supporting a scanty growth of grass and a considerable growth of palo-verde, ocotillo, greasewood, catclaw and cactus. There is no timber.

There are no settlers, and the land is valuable for grazing purposes only.
