Survey executed jointly by Otis Ross, U. S. Surveyor, and A. Parker Warner, U. S. Transitman, using Young and Sons light mountain transits numbers 6856 and 8526 respectively; both instruments being equipped with Smith solar attachments. The horizontal limbs are provided with two double verniers, reading to single minutes of arc, which is also the least count of the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

The instruments were approved, subject to satisfactory field tests, by the assistant supervisor of surveys, on November 29, 1915.

The instruments were tested in the field on Dec. 7, 1915, near the S. bdy. of sec. 34, in T. 14 N., R. 13 W., preparatory to beginning work on Group 49, being found in satisfactory condition; and the adjustments were examined and maintained throughout the work on that group by comparison with meridians determined by observations on Polaris at elongation; work on Group 51, hereinafter described, being commenced immediately thereafter, with instruments in good adjustment.

The magnetic declination in this township is 15°50'E.
