Survey executed jointly, on dates shown on diagram on page 39 of this book, by Otis Ross, U. S. Surveyor, and A. Parker Warner, U. S. Transitman.

The instruments used are described, with record of approval by the assistant supervisor of surveys for Arizona and California, and field tests, in book E. They were maintained in adjustment by frequent comparison of the results of solar observations with true meridians determined by observations of Polaris.

General Description.

The land in this township is rough, broken and mountaincus, drainage being almost entirely into Mnight and Cottonwood Creeks. Knight Creek is a stream of clear pure water, entering the township on the E. bdy. of sec. 13, and continuing with an average width of 20 lks. and depth of 1 ft., to its juncture with Cottonwood Creek, in sec. 9, near the NW. cor. Cottonwood Creek enters the township on the N. bdy. of sec. 2, and contains a stream of clear water averaging 50 lks. in width and 1 ft. in depth, which finally sinks in the sand and gravel of its wide bed, in sec. 8, whence it continues as a dry wash, leaving the township on the W. bdy. of sec. 18. Water also exists in several of the gulches.

The soil is rocky and gravelly over almost the entire area, and with the exception of a very small strip along Cottonwood Creek, which is cultivated, is non-agricultural. It supports a scant growth of grass, and a covering varying from dense to thin, of crucifixion thorn, cactus, catelaw, paloverde, greasewood, oak brush and ocotillo. Scattering juniper, pinyon and cedar is found on north slopes. Cottonwood and willow grow along Knight and Cottonwood Creeks.

The township contains two settlers, Gregorio Verdugo, in sec. 4, and an Indian family living in the NE. 4 of sec. 9.
