

Resurvey hereinafter described, executed by W.B.Kimmel U.S.Surveyor, on dates shown on dates diagram on page 37 hereof, with a Young and Sons light mountain transit, No. 8523 with solar attachment. The horizontal limb is provided with two double verniers placed opposite to each other, reading to single minutes of arc, which is also the least count of the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

Examine the adjustments of the transit and correct all errors; then to test the solar apparatus by comparing its indications resulting from solar observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian determined by observation on Polaris, I proceed as follows:

At camp which is situated in the SE. \(\frac{1}{4}\) of sec. 4, T. 5 N., R. 30 E., in latitude 33°51'N., longitude 109°11'W. at 7h 25m p.m., l.m.t., observe Polaris at eastern elongation, in accordance with Manual of Instructions, and mark a point in the line that detailed and mark a point in the line thus determined, on a peg driven firmly in the ground 5 chs. N. of instrument.

September 23, 1916.

Sept. 24: At 8 a.m., l.m.t., lay off the azimuth of Polaris $1^{\circ}22\frac{1}{2}$ to the west, and mark a point on the meridian 5 chs. N. of instrument.

The solar apparatus by repeated a.m. and p.m. observations defines positions for meridians within 0°01' of the meridian established by the Polaris observation: therefore, conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory.
