



Survey commenced June 14,1917 and executed with a Bufflight mountain solar transit No.9984 with solar attachment
The horizontal limb is provided with two double verniers,
placed opposite to each other reading to single minutes of
arc, which is also the least count of the verniers of the
latitude and declination arcs.
The instrument was examined, tested on the Federal building
meridian at Phoenix Arizona found correct, and was approved
by the Assistant Supervisor of Surveys of the district of
Arizona June 13 1917.
Preliminary to beginning the survey of this townsite I
examine the adjustments of the transit and correct all
level and collimation errors; then, to test the solar
apparatus, by comparing its indications, resulting from solar
observations, made during a.m., and p,m.hours with a meridian
established by observations on Polaris I proceed as follows;
June 14,1917. At the post, set to mark the north end center
of the Windsor Lode claim, Lot No.37 which is located in
sec. 35 TlS., Rl2E. latitude 33 17 N. longitude 111 06 10 W.
I set off 33 17 N. on the lat. arc, 23 18 N. on the decl. ard
and at 4 30 p.m. determine a meridian with the solar and

mark a point thereof by a tack driven in a stake set in the ground about 5.00 chs. N.of my instrument.

At 7^h27^m p.m.l.m.t. by my watch which is correct local mean time I observe Polaris in accordance with instructions in the Manual and mark the direction thus determined by a tack driven in a stake set in the ground about 5.00 chs. N.of

June 15,1917. At 7^h 30^m a.m.I lay off the azimuth of Polatis 0 11' to the east and mark the meridian thus determined by a tack driven in the stake set last evening on which the meridian falls .2 ins.east of the mark determined by the solar.

At 8 00 a.m., l.m.t. I set off 33 17 N on the lat. arc, 23 19'N on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar an mark a point thereof by a tack driven in the stake already set about 5.00 chs. N.of my instrument.; This point falls .4 ins east of the meridian established by the Polaris observation. The solar apparatus by p.m. and a.m. observations defines positions for meridian respectively about 0'll"west and 0'21"east of the meridian established by the Polaris observation.therefore, I conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory. Preparatory to commencing the survey of this addition to the Townsite of Superior, I make a preliminary examination of the town site boundaries in the field for the purpose of familiarizing myself with the location of the governing lines and corners as defined by monuments on the ground. and find from this examination that there are no monuments on the ground to mark either the southwest corner of the addition, designated as cor. No.1, or the cor., shown on the

sketch plat as being located on the west boundary of the Superior Townsite; therefore, since that portion of the boundary of the townsite addition between the missing corners is not controlled by adjoining mining claims and since it appears to be the intent of the application to place the southwest corner of the townsite addition on the east boundary of the Ispheming Lode claim and the other missing cor. on the west boundary of the Superior Townsite, I determine the locus of these points as follows:

I set off 33 17 N. on the lat. arc, 23 19 N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the NW.cor. of the Superior Townsite, which is an iron post 1 in. in diam. 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked as described in the original field notes. 


