Resurveys and Surveys hereinafter described, executed on dates shown on diagram on page 1, hereof by William B. Kimmel, U. S. Cadastral Engineer, using a Young and Sons light mountain transit No. 8540, described, with record of test and certificate of approval in book "G". Unless otherwise specified all measurements are made with a Lufkin 5 chain steel tape, found correct by comparison with a Lufkin standard steel tape. The measurments are made on the slope, the vertical angles determined with transit or clinometer and the slope measurments properly reduced to true horizontal distances. The instrument was maintained in adjustment throughout the survey by frequent tests.
