Unless otherwise specified, all azimuth determinations

are accomplished with the solar attachments.

Resurvey of East bdy. of Township 14 North Range 6 East Chains. This township boundary was surveyed in 1903, by W.H. Thorn, U.S.S. as a boundary of what was then known as the "Black Mesa"Forest Reserve, and also as a Range line bet. Ts.14 N., Rs.6 and 7 E., establishing the 4 sec. and sec.cor.monuments thereon at proper intervals with a common reference to areas on both sides of the line. The township cor. at each end of the line, and all of the sec.cor. monuments on line were monumented with iron posts capped with brass caps, which were designated as boundary posts and consecutively numbered from south to north. In view of the fact that the land on both sides of this line is now Forest Reserve and unsurveyed, the original designation of the Tp. and sec.cor, monuments as Forest Reserve Boundary posts is erroneous, and the line is subject to rectification in every respect. The following notes describe an independent resurvey of the entire line, destroying all the old a sec.cors., removing the old iron post sec.cor. - forest boundary posts, destroying the accessories thereto, and re-establishing all corners on line at 40.00 ch. intervals, counting from the south end of the line.
