Surveys, herein described were executed on dates shown on diagram on page 1 hereof, by Glenn F. Sawyer, U. S. Surveyor and Wesson Cook, U. S. Transitman, using respectively, Young and Sons light mountain transits No's 8478 and 8541, each equipped with full vertical circle and Smith solar attachment; unless otherwise specified, all azimuth determinations are accomplished with the solar attachment.

April 3, 1925: We examine the adjustments of the transits and find them correct; then to test the solar apparatus by comparing their indications, resulting from observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian established by Polaris observation, We proceed as follows:

At camp in the SW of sec. 31, T.10N., R.1 W., G. and S. R. Base and meridian, latitude 34°10'N., longitude 112°24½'W., at 6h 43.5m p.m., l.m.t., I, Wesson Cook with instrument No. 8541, observe Polaris at western elongation, making four observations, two each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions, and mark the mean point in line thus determined on a peg driven firmly in the ground, 10,00 chs. northerly.

Azimuth of Polaris at western elongation = 1°19'

April 4, 1925: At 7h 45m a.m., l.m.t., I lay off the azimuth of Polaris 1 19' to the east and mark the meridian thus determined by a tack in a peg driven firmly in the ground, 10 chs. N.

At 8h 0m a.m., l.m.t., We set off 34°10'N. on the lat. ares, 5°41. M. on the decl. ares; and determine a meridian with the solars which we find to agree with the true meridian.

At apparent noon, with the lat. arcs unchanged, we observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting reading of each decl. arc is 5°44' N., which agrees with the computed decl. of the sun.

At 4h 0m,p.m., 1.m.t., with the lat. arcs unchanged, we set off 5 48 N. on the decl. arcs and determine a meridian with each solar, which we find to agree with the true meridian.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1430" of the true meridian, we conclude that the adjustments of the instruments are satisfactory.

Unless otherwise specified, all measurements are made with Lufkin steel tapes, 5 chs. in length, compared with a Lufkin 1 ch. standard steel tape and found correct. The measurements are made on the slope, the vertical angle determined and the slope measurements properly reduced to true horizontal distances.

FINAL TEST OF INSTRUMENTS 8478 and 8541.

April 29,1925: We examine the adjustments of the transits and find them correct; then to test the solar apparatus by comparing their indications, resulting from observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian established by observation on Polaris on April 3,1925, and described on page 2 hereof; We proceed as follows:

At 8h 0m a.m., l.m.t., We set off 34°10'N. on the lat. atcs, 14°27'N. on the decl. arcs; and determine a meridian with the solars which we find to agree with the true meridian.

At apparent noon with the lat. arcs unchanged, we observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting reading of each decl. arc is  $14^{\circ}29^{\frac{1}{2}}$  N., which agrees with the computed decl. of the sun.

At 4h 0m p.m., l.m.t., with the lat. arcs unchanged, we set off 14°33'N. on the decl. arcs and determine a meridian with each solar, which we find to agree with the true meridian within 12' of arc.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1'30" of the true meridian, we conclude that the adjustments of the instruments are satisfactory.
