Retracements, Resurveys and Surveys herein describedwere executed on dates shown on diagram on page 1 hereof, by Glenn F. Sawyer, U. S. Surveyor and Wesson Cook, U. S. Transitman, using respectively, Young and Sons light mountain transits No's 8478 and 8487, each equipped with full vertical circle and Smith solar attachment; unless otherwise specified, all azimuth determinations are accomplished with the solar attachment.

October 27, 1925: We examine the adjustments of the transits and correct all errors; then, to test the solar apparatus, by comparing their indications, resulting from observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian established by Polaris observation, we proceed as follows:

October 28, 1926:
At camp near the north east corner of sec. 31, T8N,R1E.,
G. and S.R.B. and meridian, latitude 34°00'N., longitude
112°17½'W., at 5h Om a.m., l.m.t., Wesson Cook, with
insturment 8487, observes Polaris at western elongation,
making four observations, two each with the telescope
in direct and reversed positions, and mark the mean
point in line thus determined on a peg driven firmly

in the ground 5 chs. northerly.

Azimuth of Polaris at western elongation, 1°19'

At 7h 45m, 1.m.t., Wesson Cook lay's off the azimuth of Polaris, 1°19' to the east and marks the meridian thus determined by a tack in a peg driven firmly in the ground 5 chs. North.

At 8h 0m a.m., l.m.t., we set off 34°0' on the lat. arcs, 13°43'S. on the decl. arcs; and determine a meridian with the solars, which we find to agree with the true meridian.

At apparent noon, with the lat. arcs unchanged, we observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting reading of each decl. arc is 13°47'S., which agrees with the computed decl. of the sun.

At 4h 0m., p.m., l.m.t., with the lat. arcs unchanged, we set off $13^{\circ}49^{\frac{1}{2}}$ on the decl. arcs and determine a meridian with each solar, which we find to agree with in 1' of the true meridian.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of selar work come within 1 of the true meridian, we conclude that the adjustments of the instruments are satisfactory.

Unless otherwise specified, all measurements are made with Lufkin steel tapes, 5 chs. in length, compared with a Lufkin steel standard tape, 1 ch. in length, and found correct. The measurements are made on the slope, the vertical angle determined and the slope measurements properly reduced to true horizontal distances.

FINAL TEST OF INSTRUMENTS

A final test of Young and Sons light mountain transits No's 8478 and 8487, was made on Nov. 21, 1925 by Glenn F. Sawyer, U.S.S. and Wesson Cook, U.S.T. on meridian previously established in the NE. cor. of sec. 31, T8N, RIE., and described on page 2 herein.

November 21, 1925:

At 7h Om a.m., 1.m.t., we examine the adjustments of the transits and find them correct; then to test the solar apparatus, by camparing their indications, resulting from observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian established by Polaris, described on page 2.

At 8h 0m a.m., l.m.t., we set off 34° on the lat. arcs, $19^{\circ}50^{\frac{1}{2}}$ son the decl. arcs; and determine a meridian with the solars, which we find to agree with the true meridian.

At apparent noon, with the lat. arcs unchanged, we observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting reading of each decl. arc is 19°55'S., which agrees with the computed decl. of the sun.

At 4h Om., p.m., l.m.t., with the lat arcs unchanged, we set off 19°55'S. on the decl. arcs and determine a meridian with each solar, which we find to agree with in 1' of the true meridian.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1' of the true meridian, we conclude that the instruments were maintained in satisfactory adjustment, throughout the survey of this township

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

LAND: The drainage of this township is to the south, coming from the main range of the Bradshaw mountains. The elevation above sea level ranges from 2500 ft. to 3800 ft.

SOIL: The soil is sandy and rocky in parts and a granite formation in the higher hills ranging from 2nd to 4 th rate.

TIMBER: Scattering cottonwood along creeks.

UNDERGROWTH: Cacti, ocotilla, palo verde, catclaw, sage brush, mesquite, and fair grass.

EVIDENCE OF MINERAL:

Considerable mining has been done around Tip Top, Bald Hill, Gold Hill, and the west and northwest parts of the township. Most of the mines are not in operation now, although a little prospecting is being done in places.

WATERING PLACES: Humbug, Boulder, and Tule creeks run through the township and have good water in them we also found other small streams and springs.

SETTLEMENT: R. L. Brown, a sheep man lives in the northwest quarter. of sec. 32. We found a watchman at the old mines at Columbia and a few prospectors around the Tip Top mines. A cattleman lives in sec. 8.

INDUSTRY: The township is adapted to mining and grazing.
