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Surveys herein described were executed on dates shown on diagram on page 2 hereof, by Theodore Vander Meer, U. S. Transitman, using Young and Sons light mountain transit No. 8389, equipped with a full vertical circle and Smith solar attachment; unless otherwise specified, all azimuth determinations are accomplished with the solar attachment.

Feb. 10, 1925: examine the adjustments of the transit and find them correct; then to test the solar apparatus by comparing its indications, resulting from observations made during a.m. and p.m. hours with a meridian established by Polaris observation, proceed as follows:

At camp in approximately the NE. 4 of sec. 20 of, T.55.R.17E., (unsure) G.& S.R. Base & Meridian, Ariz, latitude 32° 10° 10° 10° 37½ W., at 10h 08.5m p.m., l.m.t., observe Polaris at observations, two each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions, and mark the mean point in line thus determined on a peg driven firmly in the ground 5 chs. northerly.

Azimuth of Polaris at western elongation, 1°18'12"

Feb. 11, 1925: At 7h 45m, a.m., a.m., lay off the azimuth of Polaris, 1°18' to the east and mark the meridian thus determined by a tack in a peg driven firmly in the ground, 5 chs. N.

At 8h 0m., a.m., l.m.t., set off 32°59'N. on the lat. arc, 14°00' S. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.

At apparent noon, with the lat. arc unchanged observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting reading of the decl. arc is 13°58'S., which agrees with the computed decl. of the sun.

At 4h Om., p.m., l.m.t., with the lat. arc unchanged, set off 13°54'S. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1.30 of the true meridian conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory.

Unless otherwise specified, all measurements are made with a Lufkin steel tape, 5 chs. in length, compared with a Lufkin 1.00 ch. standard steel tape and found correct. The measurements are made on the slope, the vertical angle determined and the slope measurements properly reduced to true horizontal distances.

The continued satisfactory adjustment of the solar apparatus throughout the survey of this township is indicated from the field test as given in book E.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The southeast and southwest corpers of this township are rolling but cut by many small but abrupt canyons. Deer Creek runs west about 5 miles north and the only living water is in this vicinity. Its south slope is very rough and broken; the north side being more gently.

The east two miles are generally a lime formation. The southwest portion is a conglomerate, exposed alomost everywhere. A limestone dyke runs through the township east and west, 4 miles north; another dyke runs NE. and SW. through section 1.

There is little or no agricultural land. The grazing

is fair.

The brush and timber in the south four miles is scattering, but quite heavy in the north two miles.
The timber consists of cedar, oak, pinyon, and cottonwood.
The brush is scrub oak, yucca, ocotilland cacti.
