The surveys hereinafter described were commenced on April 4,1926 and executed on dates shown on diagram on page 1 hereof by Benjamin J Kinsey, U.S.Surveyor, using Buff transit No.9940 and David M Daugherty, U.S.Transitman, using Young and Sons transit No.8534. Both instruments are equipped with full vertical circle and improved Smith solar attachment. unless otherwise specified all azimuth determinations are accomplished with the solar attachment except the special observations upon Polaris and the sun for meridian upon which to test the solar apparatus as stated in the field notes.

The instruments were examined, tested on the true meridian at the Federal Building at Phoenix Arizona, found correct, and were approved by the District Cadastral Engineer for Arizona and California, conditional upon satisfactory field tests.

FIELD TEST OF BUFF TRANSIT NO. 9940.

- April 4,1926, Examine the adjustments of the transit and find them correct, then in order to test the solar apparatus by comparing its indications resulting from solar observations, made during a.m. p.m. hours with a meridian established by observations on Polaris, proceed as follows;
- On the same date at the \(\frac{1}{4}\) sec. cor.of-secs.16 and 21, T40N., RIE., G.B.M.Arizona, latitude 36°51'32"N. and longitude 112°18'41"W. At 6"39.6" a.m., l.m.t. observe Polaris at western elongation, making four observations, two each with the telescope in direct and reversed-positions and mark the mean-point in the line thus determined by a tack in stake driven in the ground about 5-chs.S.
- Azimuth of Polaris at elongation = 1°21'52"W.

 April 4, At 7 30 a.m., lay off the azimuth of Polaris
 1° 22' to the east and mark the meridian thus
 determined by a tack driven in a stake set firmly
 in the ground about 5-chs. S.
- At 9 00 a.m., App. time, set off 36°51½'N. on the lat. arc, 5°36'N. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar which agrees with the meridian established by the Polaris observations.
- At apparent noon with the latitude arc unchanged, observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting reading of the declination arc is 5°38½ N. which agrees with the computed declination of the sun.
- At 3 00 p.m., App. time with the lat.arc unchanged, set off 5°41½ N.on the decl.arc and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.
- As all the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1'30" of the true meridian conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory.

FIELD TEST OF YOUNG AND SONS TRANSIT NO.8534.

- April 4,1926, At 9 00 a.m., app. time, on the true meridian described above, set off 36°51½'N. on the lat.arc 5°36', N. on the decl.arc and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.
- At apparent noon with the lat.arc unchanged, observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting reading of the decl arc is 5°38½ N. .which agrees with the computed declination of the sun.
- At 4 00 p.m., app. time with the lat.arc unchanged, set off 5° 43 ! N. on the decl.arc and determine a meridian with the solar which is found to agree with the true meridian.
- As all the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1'30" of the true meridian conclude that the adjustments of the solar are satisfactory.
- Unless otherwise specified all measurements are made with Lufkin 5-chain steel tapes, compared with a Chesterman standard steel tape, and found correct. The measurements are made on the slope, the vertical angle determined with a clinometer, and the slope measurements properly reduced to true horizontal distances.

General Description

The land embraced in this township comprises three kinds rolling, hilly, and mountainous and the soil can nearly all be classed as fourth rate.

The land is highest over the mountainous area in the

southeastern part of the township and slopes in a general northwesterly direction in the direction of the drainage.

Numerous ravines and sand washes which head in the mountainous portion of the township and flow in a westerly and northwesterly direction, form the principal drainage of the land in the township.

The township is poorly watered there being no permanent springs or other sources of living water in the township.

The hilly and mountainous portions of the township are covered with a heavy growth of cedar and pinion timber the trees, however being too small to be of any com-

the trees, however being too small to be of any commercial value, except for fencing and fuel purposes.

The soil, which for the most part, is a loose sandy or stony loam unfit for agricultural purposes, supports a fair growth of nutritious grass which afford excellent feed for cattle, horses, and sheep, thus adapting the township as a whole to the stock raising industry. industry.

There are no permanent settlers residing in the township

at this time.
