Surveys herein described were executed on dates shown on diagram on page 1 hereof, by Sidney E. Blout, U. S. Cadastral Engineer, using Buff transit No. 9940, with U-shaped standards, 4½ inch horizontal circle, 4 inch vertical circle and improved Smith solar attachment; and by John L. Warboys, U. S. Surveyor, using Young and Sons transit No. 8385, with Smith solar attachment and full vertical circle. The horizontal limbs are provided with two double verniers placed opposite to each other, reading to single minutes of arc, which is also the least count of the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs. The instruments were approved, subject to the usual field tests, by the District Cadastral Engineer for Arizona. For establishment of meridian, preliminary and final tests by Sidney E. Blout, U. S. Cadastral Engineer, see Book "B".

To test Young and Sons transit No. 8385, proceed as follows: August 20, 1929: on the meridian established June 16, 1929, by Mr. Blout, described in Book "B", examine the adjustments of the transit and the solar apparatus and find them correct.

At 8h 00m a.m., app.t., set off 33° 50 N. on the lat. arc; 12° 29½ N. on the decl. are and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.

At app. noon, with the lat. are unchanged, observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting reading of the declare is 12° 26. N., which agrees with the computed declared the sun.

At 4h 00m p.m., app.t., with the lat. arc unchanged, set off 12° 23' N. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar, which is found to agree with the true meridian.

All refraction corrections used are 83% of the tabular values on account of the elevation of 5600 ft. above sea level.

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1' of the true meridian, conclude that the adjustments of the instrument are satisfactory.

August 27, 1929: on the same meridian, established by Mr. Blout, June 16, 1929, described in Book "B", latitude 33° 50' N. 1., approximate longitude 109° 52. W., at 9h 16.3m.p.m.,l.m.t., cobserve Polaris at Eastern elongation, making ten observations, five each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions, reading the horizontal angles from the stake about 8 chs. N. of the station. The mean angle is 1° 18' to the east of the stake, which agrees with the tabular value of the azimuth of Polaris.

October 8, 1929: made hour angle observation on Polaris for latitude, the data being given in Book "A", and the observed latitude as 33° 49' 50", near the center of the SW\frac{1}{4} of sec. 17, T. 5 N., R. 27 E., G. & S.R. B. &M., Arizona. October 16, 1929: made final test of instrument, and the data is given in Book "A".

As all of the solar observations during the usual hours of solar work come within 1' of the true meridian, conclude that the adjustments of the instrument have been satisfactorily maintained throughout the survey.

satisfactorily maintained throughout the survey.
Unless otherwise specified, all azimuth determinations are accomplished with the solar apparatus. All measurements are made with a Lallie steel tape, 5 chains in length, compared with a Lufkin standard 1 chain tape and found correct. The measurements are made on the slope, the vertical angle determined with clinometer or transit and the slope measurements properly reduced to true horizontal distances for entry in the field notes.

The elevations are obtained by barometer readings carried in by Cadastral Engineer Blout and Surveyor Warboys compared and agreeing very closely with several other readings brought

in by different individuals.

The timber is maily juniper, pinion, pine and oak, with considerable cottonwood, walnut, alder and willow along the river bottoms. A comparatively small amount of the timber would be of present commercial value.

The undergrowth comprises scrub oak, mountain mahogany, manzanita, cat claw, wild locust, buck brush and cacti of various kinds.

All of the land is within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and a large number of Indians reside in the vicinity of the river bottoms. Considerable land is under cultivation, most of the crops being corn and hay, with some vegetables and a few fruit trees. Cattle and horses graze on the hills where there is an abundan be of grass in the open places during favorable seasons. There are almost daily thunder storms during the summer but the ground is very porous and the ravines and drains carry water for only a short time after the rain stops. A small amount of snow falls on the lower levels during the winter and reaches to a considerable depth on the high mountains. The elevations in the Tp. range from about 5050 to 7150 ft. above sea level.

The E. portion of the town of Whiteriver lies in the extreme western part of secs. 7 and 18 and is the head-quarters of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The E. Fork Lutheran Mission School is located in Sec. 29 and is a sectarian school, maintained by the Lutherana Church, for Indian children.
