CHAINS

The east boundary, the Arizona and New Mexico state line, was surveyed in 1875 by C. Robbins and resurveyed in 1946 by Walsh and Bilbray. The north boundary, the Third Standard Parallel North, the south and west boundaries and subdivisional lines were surveyed in 1882 by M. Santee, who also resurveyed the north boundary the same year.

The west boundary was resurveyed concurrently under this same group, by Bauer, Johnson and Oviatt. The record thereof is included in the field notes of Township 12 North, Range 30 East.

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of the north boundary (the Third Standard Parallel North), the south boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines of Township 12 North, Range 31 East.

Only the true line bearings and horizontal distances for the surveyed lines are given in these notes. Unless described, each corner was monumented with a standard iron post, 30 inches long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, flanged at the base, and with a brass cap riveted to the top.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated February 16, 1966.

The geographic position of the southeast corner of the township is: Latitude 34°23'15.13" North and Longitude 109°02'45.21" West. This position was calculated from a direct tie to U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey Triangulation Station "St. Johns," located in sec. 8, Township 12 North, Range 30 East.

The mean magnetic declination was found to be 14° East.
