·	This survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated April 25, 1969.
	Only the true line bearings and horizontal distances for the surveyed lines are given in these notes. Unless described, each corner was monumented with a standard iron post, 30 inches long, 2½ inches in diameter, flanged at the base, with a brass cap riveted to the top.
	The geographic position of the NE. corner of Section 25, as scaled from USGS quadrangle "Globe, Arizona", edition of 1947, scale 1;24000, is: Latitude 33°24'27" N. and Longitude 110°46'23" W.
_	The magnetic declination was found to be 14° East.


