CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of certain segments of the north and west boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in Townships 8 North, Ranges 22 through 26 East, Townships 9 North, Ranges 21, 22, and 25 East, Townships 10 North, Ranges 16 through 21 East, and Townships 11 North, Ranges 17 and 18 East (north boundary), and Townships 6 and 8 North, Range 15 East (west boundary), Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona.

The north boundary of what is now known as the Fort Apache Indian Reservation was originally surveyed as the north boundary of the White Mountain Indian Reservation by C. H. Wallace in 1887. This survey was superseded by a resurvey executed by J. B. Wright in 1906. Various retracements, resurveys, and remonumentation of corners have been made on the boundary throughout the townships involved and these will be shown at the beginning of the townships in the following field notes.

The west boundary of the Reservation in Townships 6 and 8 North, Range 15 East was originally surveyed by John C. Smith in 1890. Certain mile corners were remonumented by John H. Witmer, Cadastral Surveyor, in 1969.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the <u>Manual of Surveying Instructions</u>, 1947, and the special instructions dated March 25, 1970.

Prior to restoration of any corners, all pertinent lines of the original survey were retraced and a diligent search was made for any evidence of the original monuments and other calls of the official record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions. Lost corners were reestablished at proportionate positions using the Grant Boundary method, but not until exhausting every reasonable possibility of finding direct evidence of the control of each corner. For simplification of the record only the true line notes are furnished.

The directions of all lines were determined by use of the solar transit and refer to the true meridian. The lines were carried by transit method and confirmed by altitude observations on the sun.

The geographic position of the 41 Mile Corner on the north boundary of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in Township 8 North, Range 24 East (unsurveyed), as determined from U. S. Geological Survey "McNary" Quadrangle Arizona, is:

Latitude: 34° 06.7' N. Longitude: 109° 49.8' W.

The magnetic declination was observed at a number of stations throughout the resurvey and the average of the several readings was found to be 14° East.


The north boundary of the Reservation through Township 8 North, Range 26 East, with the exception of the segment from Angle Point No. 121 to the 22 Mile Corner, was resurveyed by Theodore Vander Meer in 1935. Certain angle points and mile corners were remonumented by Howard H. Thomas in 1968 and John H. Witmer in 1969.

Status of the unapproved Fort Apache Indian Reservation boundary, requested in your letter dated April 5, 1976, is as follows:

The field notes for Angle Points 288, 320, and the $34\frac{1}{2}$ mile corner have been submitted to Washington for review and final approval. The Washington office has informed us that this portion of the survey should be approved within the next 30 days.

The position established for Angle Point 246 was unacceptable by the Washington office and was removed on March 30, 1976.

Angle Point 462 was incorrectly located in the 1970 survey and was thus moved to the proper location on March 30, 1976. This point is still set in the new fence; the present corner description is:

Set a copper-coated steel stake, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., 30 ins. long, 25 ins. in the ground, in fence bearing NE. and SW., with brass cap mkd.

The following accessories to North Boundary corners were lost due to road construction when the rim road was relocated during 1975. These accessories were within the new road alignment. No corner monuments were disturbed.

Angle Point 444

8 inch diameter yellow pine marked AP 444 FAIR BT which bore N $22\frac{1}{4}$ E, 50 links distant.

Angle Point 444 is now on the reservation fence and 24 links south of the center line of the new rim road.

Angle Point 461

16 inch diameter yellow pine marked AP 461 which bore N 89 W, 45 links distant.

Angle Point 461 is now on the reservation fence and 24 links south of the center line of the new rim road.

/ Angle Point 462

12 inch diameter yellow pine marked AP 462 BT which bore S 87 $3/4\ \mbox{W}\xspace,$ 59 links distant.

Angle Point 462 is now on the reservation fence and 28 links south of the center line of the new rim road.

672 Mile Corner is now on the reservation fence and 50 links south of the center line of the new rim road. Angle Point 504

24 inch yellow pine marked AP 504 BT which bore N 5°E, 62 links distant.

Angle Point 504 is now on the reservation fence and 44 links south of the center line of the new rim road.

In addition we found the following while working through this area. Angle Point 463

A 12 inch yellow pine marked AP 463 FAIR BT bearing S 53E, 35 links distant from the corner was found. This tree was marked in 1970 during the course of the dependent resurvey work, but does not appear in the approved Field Notes for this survey. (See page 24, FIELD NOTES of the DEPENDENT RESURVEY of certain segments of the north and west boundaries of the FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION in executed by Marlin G. Livermore II under special instructions dated March 25, pleted June 15, 1970).

During the course of the Field Work in 1970 we copied on our Boundary er Cards data from the Cadastral Surveyor's Field Book on Accessory ion in relation to the corner monuments. For Angle Point 462 we re-

In the approved FIELD NOTES orientation of these accessories is described respectively as follows.

BEARS N $66\frac{1}{2}$ E, 32 LKS. DIST. BEARS S $17\frac{1}{2}$ E, 30 LKS. DIST.

When running the survey to establish the boundary line prior to construction of the new reservation boundary fence in September 1975, we were unable to locate the copper-coated steel stake which monumented this corner based upon the approved FIELD NOTES. We did, however, locate the corner based upon the data we had on our Boundary Corner Cards. We do not know the reason for the difference in the bearings and distances between what we copied in 1970 and what was approved in 1972. However, in relation to these two RM's the 1970 data we copied was the correct data.
